COUNCIL OF THE MONTH: Newcastle Student Council

On January 27th, Newcastle Student Council, led by Northeast Region Rep Preslee Fitzwater and Newcastle President Hailey Beastrom, hosted the Northeast Region Summit. This is the first Region summit that has been held during 2025, so the rest of the regions now have a good idea of what could happen. A majority of the student councils in the Northeast attended the summit and got to learn about many topics including; Mental & Women's Health, Dance Planning, Leadership games, and Canva 101. The stations were ran by some Newcastle, Sundance, Buffalo, and Thunder Basin Students for an hour right before lunch. After lunch, near the end of the summit, all of the attendees got to plan for the future with their councils, and had the opportunity to ask anyone questions.



Breakout Sessions



Hailey's session involved multiple activities that focused on building teamwork and especially trust. One game involved standing on a blanket/tarp and having a group flip over the the blanket to the backside while still standing on it, and when the group finished that they would start over, but try to finish the task with their eyes closed. The second game focused on trying to make a "human table" that would have all the kids sit in certain positions and try to stay upright



Saleen's session centered around dance planning for Homecomings, Proms, and any other dances. This is helpful for Student Council because almost every council has or will plan a dance during 2025.



Josie, Cadence, and Addison all talked about personal health. Josie focused on Women's health while Cadence and Addison were centered around Mental Health for High school students. Cadence and Addison wanted to break down the stereotype that "all leaders don't ever experience change, loss, or challenges", but rather redirect leaders to the idea that we are all human and it is okay to struggle. They educated attendees on ways to get out of mental slumps and after the presentation they concluded the workshop with writing letters to themselves.

Thunder Basin's session had students engaged by asking them many questions and see where the student stands on the subject. So this helped attendees voice their opinions and show reasoning for why their opinion is the way it is.

Madeline and Kellie wanted to show students the basics of using canva and how they become better digital artists and they ended the presentations by printing out pictures that the attendees created with canva.
